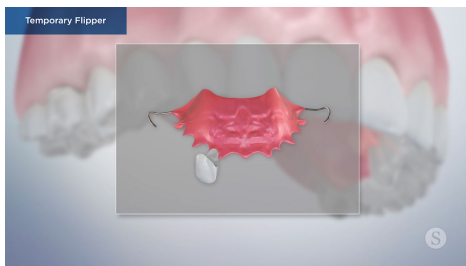


## Temporary Flipper



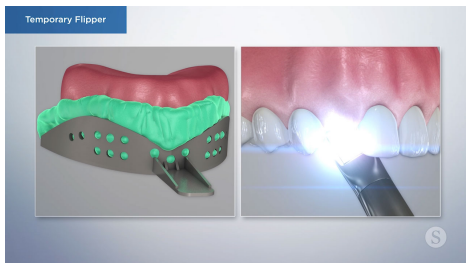
If you're missing one or more of your front teeth, a flipper, or flipper tooth, is an excellent first step toward restoring your smile.



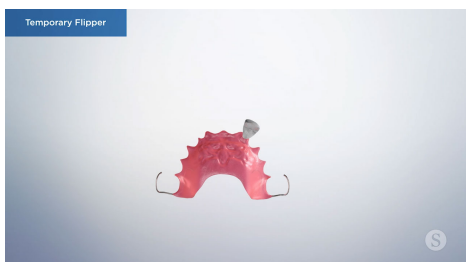
A flipper is an acrylic, removable, partial denture that usually serves as a temporary solution while you wait to receive your permanent or long-term restoration.



It is called a flipper because it is a retainer that can easily be removed, or flipped out of the mouth, with the tongue.

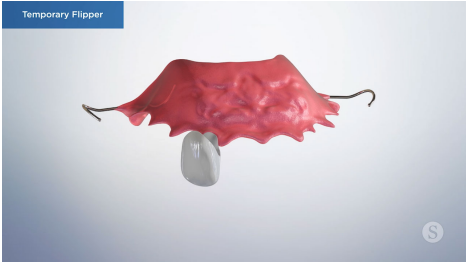


To create a flipper, your doctor will either take an impression - or mold - of your teeth, or use a special 3-D camera to digitally scan the area.



The impression or scan is sent to a dental laboratory where it will be designed and fabricated especially for you.

Temporary Flipper



Flippers are usually made of a lightweight acrylic resin that blends with the color of your gums and has a prosthetic tooth or teeth attached.

Temporary Flipper



The acrylic fitting will either rest on your jaw, be fitted along your palate, or clasp to adjacent teeth to stay in place, depending on its specific location in your mouth.

With a flipper you will be able to maintain your appearance and restore function while you recover from tooth extractions or dental implant surgery.
